HEMEROCALLIS FACT SHEET

There are approximately twenty species of Hemerocallis found mainly in China, Manchuria, Mongolia, Siberia, Korea, Japan and northern India. The first records of hemerocallis in cultivation date back 2500 years in northern China. Hemerocallis is commonly known as daylilies as the blooms last only a day, but many more buds are produced opening in quick succession.

Hemerocallis is related to Hostas. They are medium to high, densely clumped perennials, with fleshy, occasionally tuberous roots. The leaves are basal, linear, and can be evergreen or deciduous. The majority of the varieties we offer are deciduous.

The daylily species are very undemanding perennials, with no exceptional soil requirements, but for the best flowering performance ample fertiliser is needed. Over recent years up to 500 new forms are being registered annually. Tall upright stems are topped with clusters of large, colourful, often highly scented flowers. Colours now range from pale yellow through to orange, pinks, reds, coppery shades and purple-reds, many showing distinctive darker throats, zoning or mid-petal bands.

Modern hybrids lend themselves to many forms of garden ornamentation, and are equally at home in the herbaceous border, interspersed among shrubs or naturalising in grassy woodlands. They make very good groundcover plants, their dense foliage excluding light to the soil.

Brilliant true red with golden yellow throat, June - August, 75cm high.

Large orange trumpet flowers, August - September, 80cm high.

Melon pink flowers, June - August, 60-80cm high.

Blaze of Fire

Golden peach flowers, July - August, 60cm high.

Bonanza

Pale orange with brown throat, July - September, 75cm high.

Burning Daylight

Fragrant orange, June - August, 60cm high. AGM.

Canary Glow

Vivid canary yellow flowers with almost evergreen foliage, July - September, 60cm high.

Catherine Woodbery

Fragrant, light lavender pink with green throat, July - Sept. 75cm high.

Cherry Cheeks

Cherry red flowers striped cream, July - August, 80cm high.

Cool It

Pure white flowers, July - August, 70cm high.

Corky

Small, yellow trumpet shaped blooms, June - August, 75cm high. AGM.

Cream Drop

Creamy yellow flowers, June - August, 60cm high.

Crimson Pirate

Red, July - August, 70cm high.

Ennie Fanfare

Red/green throat, July - August, 35cm high

Evelyn Claar

Pink, June - August, 50cm high.

Golden Chimes

Masses of small, golden yellow flowers, June - August, 60cm high. AGM.

Houdini

Violet-pink flowers with a creamy eye zone, June - August, 60cm high.

Joan Senior

Lightly ruffled and scented white flowers with a pale green throat, June - August, 90cm high.

Luxury Lace

Lavender with apple green throat and frilled petals, June - August, 75cm high.

Missouri Beauty

Striking soft lemon yellow flowers, May - August, 70cm high.

Night Beacon

Dark velvety red with yellow throat, June - August, 70cm high.

Pink Damask

Rich salmon pink flowers, June - August, 75cm high.

Red Rum

Orangy red with light yellow vertical striping into a lemon yellow throat, June - August, 50cm high.

Sammy Russell

Brick red flowers, July - September, 70cm high.

Siloam Dream Baby

Creamy-apricot ruffled flowers with a distinctive dark red-purple eye band and a green throat, June - August, 45cm high.

Stafford

Deep red with orange-yellow throat, July - September, 90cm high.

Still the most popular red. (Limited availability).

Stella de Oro

Small canary yellow bell shaped flowers, dwarf habit, June - September, 30-50cm high. AGM.

Texas Sunlight

Golden ruffled flowers, June - August, 60cm high. (Limited availability).

Whistling Swan

Very pale yellow with greenish throat, June - August, 60cm high.

lilioasphodelus (flava)

Clear yellow scented flowers, June - August, 75-90cm high. AGM.

middendorffii

Bright orange-yellow, fragrant and compact flowers, June - August, 60cm high.
